

Waffle Stitch Kitchen Towel Crochet Pattern

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<p>Abbreviations – US Terms</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>ch/chs</i> – <i>chain/chains</i>• <i>st/sts</i> - <i>stitch/stitches</i>• <i>dc</i> – <i>double crochet stitch</i>• <i>fpdc</i> - <i>front post double crochet stitch</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Scissors• tapestry needle• H, 5 mm crochet hook• 2- Lion brand Cotton-Ease 3.5 oz/100g 185 yd/169m indigo• 1- Lion brand Cotton-Ease 3.5 oz/100g 185 yd/169m pewter
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You can make a larger or smaller dish towel or a blanket by using 3 +2 chain. The chain counts as the first double crochet of the row.

ch 62

Row 1: *dc* in 4th *ch* from hook and in each *st* across, turn.

Row 2: Chain 2, **fpdc* in next *st*, *dc* in next 2 *sts*, repeat from * until the last 2 *sts*; *fpdc* in next *st*, *dc* in top of ch, turn.

Row 3: **dc* in next *st*, *fpdc* in the next 2 *sts*, repeat from *until the last 2 *sts*; *dc* in next *st*, *dc* in top of ch, turn.

Repeat rows 2 and 3 until you have 52 rows.

Color changes: 6 rows of Indigo, 2 rows of Pewter, 14 rows of Indigo, 10 rows of Pewter, 14 rows of Indigo, 2 rows of Pewter, 6 rows of Indigo.
