## Waffle Stitch Kitchen Towel Crochet Pattern

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Abbreviations – US Terms	Scissors
<ul> <li>ch/chs – chain/chains</li> <li>st/sts - stitch/stitches</li> <li>dc – double crochet stitch</li> <li>fpdc - front post double crochet stitch</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>tapestry needle</li> <li>H, 5 mm crochet hook</li> <li>2- Lion brand Cotton-Ease 3.5 oz/100g 185 yd/169m indigo</li> <li>1- Lion brand Cotton-Ease 3.5 oz/100g 185 yd/169m pewter</li> </ul>

You can make a larger or smaller dish towel or a blanket by using 3 +2 chain. The chain counts as the first double crochet of the row.

ch 62

Row 1: *dc* in 4th *ch* from hook and in each *st* across, turn.

Row 2: Chain 2, \**fpdc* in next *st*, *dc* in next 2 *sts*, repeat from \* until the last 2 *sts*; *fpdc* in next *st*, *dc* in top of ch, turn.

Row 3: \*dc in next st, fpdc in the next 2 sts, repeat from \*until the last 2 sts; dc in next st, dc in top of ch, turn.

Repeat rows 2 and 3 until you have 52 rows.

Color changes: 6 rows of Indigo, 2 rows of Pewter, 14 rows of Indigo, 10 rows of Pewter, 14 rows of Indigo, 2 rows of Pewter, 6 rows of Indigo.
