

Waffle Stitch Potholder Crochet Pattern

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<p>Abbreviations – US Terms</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>ch/chs</i> – <i>chain/chains</i>• <i>st/sts</i> - <i>stitch/stitches</i>• <i>dc</i> – <i>double crochet stitch</i>• <i>fpdc</i> - <i>front post double crochet stitch</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Scissors• tapestry needle• H, 5 mm crochet hook• 1 -2.5 oz Lion Brand Re-Up Cotton Yarn in navy or any worsted weight gauge 4 cotton yarn or 117 yd
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front post double crochet stitch – yarn over, insert the hook behind the post from the front across the post and through the other side, yo, pull up a loop, yo, pull thru 2 loops on your hook, yo, pull thru remaining two loops on your hook. You can make a larger or smaller hot pad or a blanket by using 3 + 2 chain. The chain counts as the first double crochet of the row.

Size: 9 in x 9 in (23 cm)

ch 32 in Navy

Row 1: *dc* in 4th *ch* from hook and in each *st* across, turn.

Row 2: Chain 2, **fpdc* in next *st*, *dc* in next 2 *sts*, repeat from * until the last 2 *sts*; *fpdc* in next *st*, *dc* in top of ch, turn.

Row 3: Chain 2, **dc* in next *st*, *fpdc* in the next 2 *sts*, repeat from *until the last 2 *sts*; *dc* in next *st*, *dc* in top of ch, turn.

Repeat rows 2 and 3 until you have 19 rows or the length you want.

Repeat the above pattern for the 2nd side. Then put both pieces wrong sides on top of each other and whip stitch or sew the 4 sides into together.
