

## Waffle Stitch Dishcloth Crochet Pattern

<p>Abbreviations – US Terms</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <i>ch/chs</i> – <i>chain/chains</i></li><li>• <i>st/sts</i> - <i>stitch/stitches</i></li><li>• <i>dc</i> – <i>double crochet stitch</i></li><li>• <i>fpdc</i> - <i>front post double crochet stitch</i></li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Scissors</li><li>• tapestry needle</li><li>• H, 5 mm crochet hook</li><li>• 1 -3.5 oz Lion Brand 24/7 Cotton Yarn in navy or any worsted weight gauge 4 cotton yarn</li></ul>
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**front post double crochet stitch** – yarn over, insert the hook behind the post from the front across the post and through the other side, yo, pull up a loop, yo, pull thru 2 loops on your hook, yo, pull thru remaining two loops on your hook. You can make a larger or smaller crocheted cotton dishcloth or a blanket by using 3 + 2 chain. The chain counts as the first double crochet of the row.

Size: 8.5 in x 8.5 in (22 cm)

ch 32 in Navy

Row 1: *dc* in 4th *ch* from hook and in each *st* across, turn.

Row 2: Chain 2, \**fpdc* in next *st*, *dc* in next 2 *sts*, repeat from \* until the last 2 *sts*; *fpdc* in next *st*, *dc* in top of ch, turn.

Row 3: Chain 2, \**dc* in next *st*, *fpdc* in the next 2 *sts*, repeat from \*until the last 2 *sts*; *dc* in next *st*, *dc* in top of ch, turn.

Repeat rows 2 and 3 until you have 20 rows or the length you want.

Knot end and cut yarn. Weave in yarn ends.
