

## Triple Berry Crochet Blanket Pattern

Supplies	Abbreviations – US Terms
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Scissors</li><li>• tapestry needle</li><li>• N, 9 mm crochet hook</li><li>• 6 – 10.5 oz Bernat Blanket O'Go Yarn – Winter Berry any super bulky gauge 6 yarn (660yd)</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• sc – single crochet</li><li>• bobble – bobble stitch 4 double crochet together</li><li>• ch– chain</li><li>• YO – yarn over</li><li>• hhdc - herringbone half double crochet</li></ul>

**Special stitch:** Bobble stitch -dc4tog – Yarn over (*yo*) and pull up a loop, now pull through two. (2 loops left on hook) *yo* into the same space as before, pull up a loop, pull through two, (3 loops left on the hook), *yo* and do it again, (4 loops left) *yo*, do the same again, (5 loops, you got it) Now *yo* and pull through all those 5 loops. Stitch is complete.

**special stitch** -herringbone half double crochet stitch – yarn over, insert your hook into the stitch. *Yo* and pull back through the stitch and the next loop on the hook. *Yo*, pull through remaining two loops on the hook. [Video How to](#)

For the bobble stitch, you need a single crochet stitch between each of the bobble stitches. You also need to alternate with a row between each of the bobble rows otherwise the texture will not be on the same side.

### Tips

- You can make a larger or smaller crochet blanket by using an even number for the chain.
- The chain counts as the first stitch for each row.
- If you use the O'Go yarn you will want to separate it into the 3 colors.
- The color changes at the end of the pattern

Approx. crochet blanket size: 45 in x 56 in (114 cm x 142 cm)

### Color A –Burgundy

Chain 86

Row 1: *hhdc* in the 3rd chain and each *ch* until the end of the row. Chain 2 turn.

Rows 2-5: *hhdc* in 1st stitch, and in each stitch across. Chain 2 turn. On last row, chain 1 and turn, if the next row is bobbles, if not, Chain 2 and turn.

Row 6-10: **hhdc** in 2nd stitch, and in each stitch across. Chain 2 turn. On last row, chain 1 and turn, if the next row is bobbles, if not, Chain 2 and turn

### **Color B - Blue Gray**

Rows 11: **Bobble** in 2nd stitch, **sc** in 3rd stitch. **\*Bobble, sc\*** repeat to the end of the row. Last stitch is **sc**. Chain 2 and turn.

Row 12: **hhdc** in 2nd stitch, and in each stitch across. Chain 2 turn. On last row, chain 1 and turn, if the next row is bobbles, if not, Chain 1 and turn.

Row 13: **Bobble** in 2nd stitch, **sc** in 3rd stitch. **\*Bobble, sc\*** repeat to the end of the row. Last stitch is **sc**. Chain 2 and turn.

There are 78 rows. Follow the color change and the stripe change below.

For rows that are hhdc, 5 rows: **hhdc** in 2nd stitch, and in each stitch across. Chain 2 turn. On last row, chain 1 and turn, if the next row is bobbles, if not, Chain 2 and turn.

For rows that are bobble, 3 rows:

Row 11: **Bobble** in 2nd stitch, **sc** in 3rd stitch. **\*Bobble, sc\*** repeat to the end of the row. Last stitch is **sc**. Chain 2 and turn.

Row: **hhdc** in 2nd stitch, and in each stitch across. Chain 2 turn. On last row, chain 1 and turn, if the next row is bobbles, if not, Chain 1 and turn.

Row: **Bobble** in 2nd stitch, **sc** in 3rd stitch. **\*Bobble, sc\*** repeat to the end of the row. Last stitch is **sc**. Chain 2 and turn.

Color changes: 5 rows of Burgundy (hhdc), 5 Rows of Blue Gray (hhdc), 3 rows of Terracotta (bobble), 5 row of Burgundy (hhdc), 5 rows of Blue Gray(hhdc), 3 rows of Terracotta (bobble), 5 rows of Burgundy (hhdc), 5 rows of Terracotta (hhdc), 3 Rows of Blue Gray (bobble), 5 rows of Terracotta (hhdc), 3 rows of Burgundy (bobble), 5 rows of Blue Gray (hhdc), 5 rows of Terracotta (hhdc), 3 rows of Blue Gray (bobble), 5 rows of Burgundy (hhdc), 5 rows of Terracotta (hhdc), 3 rows of Burgundy (bobble), 5 rows of Blue Gray (hhdc).

Where there is 5 rows, it is 5 rows of half double crochet. Where there are 3 rows, it is 1 row of bobble and single crochet, followed by 1 row of half double crochet. Then another row of bobble and single crochet.

Tie and cut off. Weave in ends using a tapestry needle. Enjoy your quick and easy chunky throw blanket.
