

## Low Tide Shell Cowl Crochet Pattern

Supplies	Abbreviations – US Terms
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Scissors</li><li>• tapestry needle</li><li>• 1- J 5.75 MM crochet hook</li><li>• 1 - Hand Dyed Yarns <a href="#">A Chick That Knitz</a> in Low Tide, or any gauge 4 yarn worsted weight yarn 280 yd (100 gm)</li><li>• 1 - 6 oz (170.1 g) <a href="#">Caron Simply Soft</a> in Dark Country Blue or any gauge 4 yarn worsted weight yarn</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>ch</b> – chain</li><li>• <b>yo</b> – yarn over</li><li>• <b>sc</b> – single crochet</li><li>• <b>dc</b> – double crochet</li><li>•</li></ul>

To make the pattern smaller or larger use a multiple of 6 + 2 for the chain.

Size: Adult women approx. 7 in x 15.5 in flat (18 cm x 39 cm)

### Chain 116

**Row 1:** In the 2nd chain from the hook, and in each chain across, sc. Chain 1 and turn.

**Row 2:** \*Skip two chains, work 5 **dc** into the next chain space. Skip two chains again, one **sc**. into the next chain. Repeat the instructions from the \* to the end. Your last stitch will be a **sc**. into the final chain. Chain 3 and turn.

**Row 3:** In the top of the **sc**. you made from the row below, work 2 **dc**. (You just created a half shell) now look for the middle **dc** of the shell (the 3rd **dc**) and **sc**. Skip over the next 2 **dc**, find the **sc**. of the row below and work 5 **dc**. Continue across working a **sc**. into the third **dc**, and a “shell” into the **sc**. Your last stitch will be a half shell (3 **dc**). Chain 1 and turn.

**Row 4:** 1 **sc** into the very next stitch, the last **dc** you made on the row below. Skip over the 2 **dc** and work 5 **dc** into the **sc**. End this row with a **sc** into the last stitch, chain 3 and turn.

Repeat Rows 3-4 until you have 16 rows or the height you want.

Knot, cut end and weave ends with a tapestry needle.

The color change is 4 rows of the low tide then 1 row of the dark blue, then 3 rows of the low tide, followed by 1 row of the dark blue. Repeat and finish with low tide.

## Finishing

Fold the rectangle in half on the horizontal. Then slip or whip stitch the edges together to form the cowl. You can pin the edges together if it helps.

Weave end all ends. Enjoy your free shell stitch cowl crochet pattern.
