

Woodland Linen Stitch Crochet Blanket Pattern

Supplies	Abbreviations – US Terms
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• scissors• tapestry needle• 4 mm crochet hook• 4 -5.3 oz (150 g) Lion Brand Mandala Yarn in Dragon or any gauge 3 light dk weight yarn 590 yd (540 m)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>yo</i> – <i>yarn over</i>• <i>ch</i>– <i>chain stitch</i>• <i>sc</i> – <i>single crochet</i>• <i>sk</i>– <i>skip stitch</i>

Size: 36 in x 60 in (91 cm x 152 cm)

Start with a different color on each of the skeins of the yarn. I started with a blue and green.

Before finish the sc at the end of the row change to the 2nd color. Carry the 1st color on top of the last row as you crochet over it.

Occasionally check the color you are crocheting over to make sure it is flat and there is no loops. You can lightly tug on the blanket to smooth out the gaps or loops.

You can make a larger or smaller crochet blanket an even number for the chain.

Chain 180

Row 1: *sc* in the 4th chain from the hook, 1 *ch*, *sk* the next stitch, *sc* in the next stitch. Repeat until the end of the row ending with a *sc* in the last chain. Chain 2, turn.

Before finish the sc at the end of the row change to the 2nd color. Carry the 1st color on top of the last row as you crochet over it.

Row 2: *sc* in the chain space from the row below. Then **ch* 1, *sk* 1 *sc*, *sc* in next *ch* 1 space*. Repeat from * until the end of the row. The last *sc* is worked into the space between the *ch* 2 turning chain and *sc* from the row before. Chain 2, turn.

Before finish the sc at the end of the row change to the 2nd color. Carry the 1st color on top of the last row as you crochet over it.

Repeat Row 2 until you have 200 rows or the length you want.

Cut yarn and knot. Weave in ends.
