

## Fall Stripe Throw Pattern

Supplies	Abbreviations – US Terms
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 8 mm crochet hook</li><li>• scissors</li><li>• tapestry needle – yarn needle</li><li>• 5- 3.5 oz (100 g) Lion Brand Basic Stitch Thick &amp; Quick Yarn in Maize or any gauge 5 yarn, 87 yd (80 m)</li><li>• 5- 3.5 oz (100 g) Lion Brand Basic Stitch Thick &amp; Quick Yarn in Clay or any gauge 5 yarn, 87 yd (80 m)</li><li>• 5- 3.5 oz (100 g) Lion Brand Basic Stitch Thick &amp; Quick Yarn in Spice or any gauge 5 yarn, 87 yd (80 m)</li><li>• 5- 3.5 oz (100 g) Lion Brand Basic Stitch Thick &amp; Quick Yarn in Hazelwood or any gauge 5 yarn, 87 yd (80 m)</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>sc</b> – single crochet stitch</li><li>• <b>hdc</b> – half double crochet stitch</li><li>• <b>bobble</b>– bobble stitch</li><li>• <b>YO</b> - Yarn over</li></ul>

Use a multiple of 10 + 7 for the chain to make it longer or shorter. To make it wider increase the rows, 3 rows of **hdc** and 1 row of the bobbles. Chain counts as the 1st stitch of each row.

Size of blanket: 50 in x 66 in (127 cm x 168 cm)

**Special stitch:** Bobble stitch- 4 double crochet together in one stitch.

**YO** hook insert hook into the next stitch in the row. **YO** and draw up a loop. **YO** and draw through the first 2 loops on the hook. **YO** insert our hook and draw through the loop, you should have 4 loops on your hook.

**YO** draw through the first 2 loops only and you should have 3 loops on your hook. **YO** and insert hook and draw through that will give you 5 loops on your hook.

**YO** and draw through the first 2 loops. 4 loops on hook. **YO** and draw up a loop. **YO** and draw through 2 loops. **YO** and draw through the rest of the 5 loops. Stitch completed.

Written Fall Stripe Throw Pattern

Ch 127 in Maize (the chain is lengthwise)

Row 1: **hdc** in the 3rd chain from the hook. **hdc** in each stitch across. Chain 2 and turn.

Row 2-3 *hdc* in the 2nd stitch and each stitch across. Chain 2 and turn. Chain 1 and turn for row 3.

Row 4: 5 *sc* in next 5 stitches . \*1 bobble, 2 *sc*, 1 bobble, 6 *sc* \*. Repeat \*\*. Chain 2 and turn.

Row 5-8: *hdc* in the 2nd stitch and each stitch across. Chain 2 and turn. Last row chain 1.

Repeat Row 4-8 until you have 155 rows.

To finish the blanket, cut the yarn and knot. Weave in all yarn ends.

When finishing a bulky or super bulky yarn blanket, you want to make sure you go back and forth when you weave the ends in so they don't work their way out when the the blanket is used. Also, it helps to leave longer yarn tails to weave in.

Color Changes: gold, red, brown, orange, red, brown, orange, gold, brown, red, gold, orange, red, brown, orange, yellow, brown, red, gold, orange, red, brown, orange, red, gold, orange, brown, gold, red, brown, orange, red, gold, orange, brown, gold, red, brown, orange

This pattern is 3 rows of half double crochet followed by 1 row of 6 single crochets and then 2 bobbles with 2 single crochets between the bobble.

There is 6 single crochet stitches before and after each group of bobbles. The bobbles are made using 4 double crochet together stitches in the same stitch.
