

Variegated Stripe Crochet Scarf Pattern

Supplies	Abbreviations – US Terms
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• scissors• tapestry needle• 1- H 5 mm crochet hook• 2- 8 oz (227 g) Caron Cinnamon Swirl Cakes in Oyster or any gauge 4 worsted weight yarn 407 yd (372 m) I used about 1/3 of the 2nd skein.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>yo</i> – yarn over• <i>st/sts</i> - stitch• <i>ch</i> - chain• <i>hdc</i>- half double crochet• <i>fpdc</i>– front post double crochet• <i>bpdc</i> – double crochet back post• <i>dc</i>– double crochet

front post double crochet stitch – yarn over, insert the hook behind the post from the front, yo, pull up a loop, yo, pull thru 2 loops on your hook, yo, pull thru remaining two loops on your hook. For more info [here](#), from yarnspirations.com.

back post double crochet stitch – yarn over, insert the hook from the back of the post, yo, pull up a loop, yo, pull thru 2 loops on your hook, yo, pull thru remaining two loops on your hook. For more info [here](#), from yarnspirations.com.

To make a larger or smaller project, start your chain with an even number. This scarf uses the rice stitch which is front and back post double crochet stitches alternating.

The chain will be the length of your scarf so you will want to check the length of the chain to make sure you are happy with the length of the scarf. I double check the length after I do the first row of single crochet.

A good length for a scarf is between 60 in to 70 in. You will want it longer or shorten due to the person's height. You also might want it longer if it is really cold where you live and you want to wrap the scarf several times.

Size: Adult women approx. 7.5 in x 64 in (19 cm x 163 cm)

Scarf Crocheting Pattern

Chain 202

Row 1: *sc* in the 2nd chain from the hook and in each chain cross. Chain 3 and turn.

Row 2: Dc in 3rd *ch* from the hook. *dc* in each st to the end. Chain 1 and turn.

Row3: *Ch* 1, *hdc* in 1st *st*. **fpdc* around next stitch, *bpdc* around next *st*; repeat from * until you have 2 *sts* remaining. *Fpdc*, *hdc* in top of turning *ch*. Chain 1, and turn.

Repeat row 3 until you have 18 rows or the height you want. End with a row of single crochet.

Cut yarn and weave in ends with a tapestry needle.
