

Sedge Stitch Dishcloth Crochet Pattern

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Supplies	Abbreviations – US Terms
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Scissors• tapestry needle• H, 5 mm crochet hook• 5, 3.75 mm crochet hook - for smaller wash cloth• 1– 2.5 oz Lion Brand Re-up Cotton Yarn – in Confetti – I used all of it• 1 – 3 oz Lily Sugar n Cream in faded denim any other worsted weight cotton yarn approx 2.5oz	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>yo</i> – yarn over• <i>sl</i> – slip stitch• <i>sc</i> – single crochet• <i>hdc</i> – half double crochet• <i>dc</i> – double crochet stitch

You can make a larger or smaller [dishcloth](#) or a blanket by using an multiple of 3 + 2 for the chain.

Smaller crochet wash cloth - Approx. 9 in x 10.5 in (22 cm x 26 cm)

Chain 41

Row 1: In 2nd chain from the hook, *hdc, dc*, skip 2 chains and in the next work *sc, hdc, dc*. Skip 2 chains and repeat “*sc, hdc, dc*” into the next space. Repeat across to the end and there is one chain left. Work 1 *sc*. Chain 1, turn.

Row 2: *hdc* and DC into the top of the *sc* you just made. Skip over the *dc* and *hdc*, **“sc, hdc, dc”* into the *sc**. Repeat the pattern across ending the last stitch with one single crochet. Chain 1, turn.

You’ll always be looking for the *sc* to do your “*sc, hdc, dc*” into.

Repeat row 2 until you have used all the yarn, 28 rows. Cut yarn, weave in ends.

Larger wash cloth -

Approx. 11 in x 11 in (28 cm x 28 cm)

Chain 41

Follow as above until you have 27 rows.
