

Seed Stitch Trivet Pattern

Supplies <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 2 – 2oz (56.7 g) Peaches and Crème Stripey Cotton Yarn in Energetic Pink) or any worsted weight cotton yarn gauge 4 light 102 yds (93 m)• 3.5 crochet hook• Tapestry or yarn needle• scissors	Abbreviations – US Terms <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>ch/chs</i> – <i>chain/chains</i>• <i>st/sts</i> - <i>stitch/stitches</i>• <i>sc</i> - <i>single crochet stitch</i>• <i>slst-blo</i> – <i>slip stitch in the back loop only</i>
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Size: 7.5 in x 7.5 in (19 cm)

Ch 39

Row 1: In the 2nd chain from the hook, * slst, sc, repeat from * across to the end of the chain. End with a sc. Ch 1 and turn.

Row 2: * slst-blo, sc, repeat from * across the row. End with an sc. Ch1 and turn.

Repeat Row 2 until you have 41 rows or the length you want.

To make a potholder or trivet make another one the same size. Then sew them together around all 4 sides.

You can also make a wider square. Chain 68 and fold it in half and sew the 3 sides.

Another alternative is using 2 strand of yarn at the same time. I haven't done this with a potholder. I am not certain it would be thick enough to be a good potholder.

- For the chain you need an odd number
- You do 1 slip stitch in the back loop, 1 single crochet and alternate
- The row always starts with 1 slip stitch in the same space as the chain 1 you just did. The row always ends with a single crochet.
- The chain 1 does not count as the first stitch of the row.

- The back loop means going through just the loop furthest away from you instead of going through both of the loops like usual.
