

## Blue Green Chenille Throw Blanket Crochet Pattern

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| <b>Supplies</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 4-10.5 oz of Bernat Baby Blanket Yarn Dappled in Aquamarine or any gauge #6 super bulky yarn</li><li>• 10 mm crochet hook</li><li>• Scissors</li><li>• Yarn or tapestry needle</li></ul> | <b>Abbreviations – US Terms</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>ch/chs</b> – chain/chains</li><li>• <b>st/sts</b> - stitch/stitches</li><li>• <b>sc</b> – single crochet stitch</li><li>• <b>dc</b> – double crochet stitch</li></ul> |
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### Silt Stitch Tips

- Chain a multiple of 3 for the chain to make the project larger or smaller.
- Turning chain counts as the 1<sup>st</sup> stitch of the row.
- The 2<sup>nd</sup> Row is 1 single crochet, 2 double crochet in the same stitch.
- The last stitch of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Row is always a single crochet.
- The 3<sup>rd</sup> Row is a row of double crochet.

Size: 62 in x 62 in (157 cm)

Ch 96

Row 1: Dc in the 4<sup>th</sup> ch from the hook and in each st across. Ch 1 and turn.

Row 2: In the 2nd st, (1 sc, 2 dc). \* Skip the next 2 sts. (1 sc, 2 dc.)\* Repeat from \* to the last three stitches, skip 2 sts, sc in last st. Ch 3 and turn.

Row 3: Skip 1<sup>st</sup> st (at the base of your turning chain), dc in the next st and in each st across. Ch 1 and turn.

Repeat Rows 2-3 until you have 56 rows or the length you want. Cut yarn, knot, and weave in ends.
