

2 Tone Textured Crochet Cowl Pattern

Supplies <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Scissors• tapestry needle• H, 5 mm crochet hook• 1 ball of each Lion Brand Homespun Yarn 6 oz, Pearls & Desert Mountain, gauge 5 yarn (approx. 1 oz or 35 yd of each color) or any bulky gauge yarn.	Abbreviations – US Terms <ul style="list-style-type: none">• <i>sl</i> – <i>slip stitch</i>• <i>sc</i> – <i>single crochet</i>• <i>ch</i> – <i>chain</i>• <i>sk</i> – <i>skip</i>• <i>sp</i> – <i>space</i>• <i>blo</i> – <i>crochet in back loop only</i>
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special stitch – single back loop only (*blo*)– do the single crochet like your normally would but only put the hook in the back loop (the loop the farthest away from you).

Gauge: 8 single crochet x 5 rows = 3 in x 3 in (7.62 cm x 7.62 cm)

Size: Adult women approx. 11 in x 13 in flat (28 cm x 33 cm)

Decide how wide you want to make the cowl. To make bigger or smaller increase or decrease the rows by 2s in the ribbed part of the pattern. Use the same amount of stitches in the body part.

This crocheting pattern uses the moss stitch for the main part.

ch 25 in color A – Desert Mountain

Row 1: *sc* in the second *ch* from the hook and *sc* across (24). Turn.

Row 2-68: *ch* 1, *sc* in the *blo* across (24). Turn.

When you finish the ribbed band, fold it half so row 1 and row 68 match up. Working through the back loop of Row 68 and the front loop of Row 1, seam the two rows together by slip stitching across. Cut your yarn.

Change to **Color B** -Pearls

Round 1: *ch* 1, *sc* around the top of the band working one stitch per row (68). Attach to first *sc* of the round with a *sl*.

Round 2: *ch* 1, **SC*, *ch* 1, skip 1, repeat from * around. Attach to the first *sc* of the round with a *sl*. (68).

Round 3: *sc* 2, skip 1, *sc* in *ch* space from previous round, **ch* 1, skip 1, *sc* in the *ch* space from the previous round, repeat from * around. Attach to the 2nd *ch* from the starting *ch* 2 with a *sl*.
(68)

Rounds 4-6: Continue repeating Round 2 and Round 3.

Cut yarn and tie off. Repeat on the other end of the cowl. Cut yarn and tie off. Weave in all ends.
