

Mini Basketweave Stitch Dishcloth

Supplies

- 4.5 mm crochet hook
- Tapestry needle
- Scissors
- 14 oz (400 g) Classic Cotton Big Ball Loops and threads in twine, sand, sage or any cotton 4 gauge yarn 664 yd (608 m)

Abbreviations – US Term

- **ch** – chain
- **yo** – yarn over
- **dc** – double crochet
- **fpdc** – double crochet front post
- **bpdc** – double crochet back post
- **hdc** – half double crochet

Mini Basketweave Stitch

Ch 34 Chain a even number

Row 1: *Dc* in 3rd *ch* from the hook. *dc* in each *ch* to the end. Chain 1 and turn.

Row 2: *hdc* in 1st *st*. **fpdc* around next 2 stitches, *bpdc* around next 2 *sts*; repeat from * until you have 1 *st* remaining. *hdc* in top of turning *ch*. Chain 2 and turn.

Row 3: *hdc* in 1st *st*. **bpdc* around next 2 stitches, *fpdc* around next 2 *sts*; repeat from * until you have 1 *st* remaining. *hdc* in top of turning *ch*. Chain 2 and turn.

Repeat row 2-3 until you have 16 rows or the length you want.

Border

Row 1: turn chain 1. Sc in each stitch and 4 in each corner, 2 on each side. On the sides single crochet along the sides put 2 single crochet for each *hdc*.

Row 2: single crochet in each stitch around and 4 in each corner. Slip stitch to the first stitch. Cut yarn and weave in ends with a tapestry needle.
